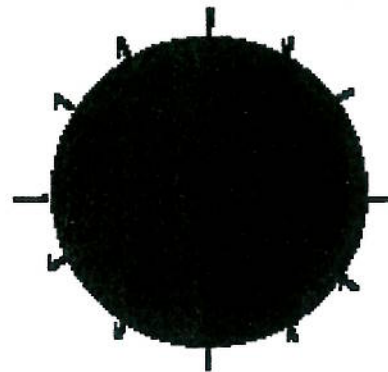


Stereo Scratch 'n Sniff

Future Meetings

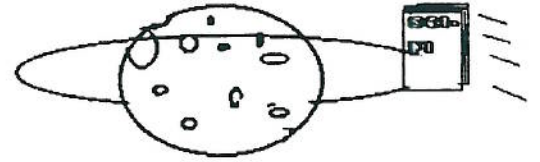
Harry Turtledove consented to come and speak for us in July. In October Steve Sansweet is rescheduled to appear.

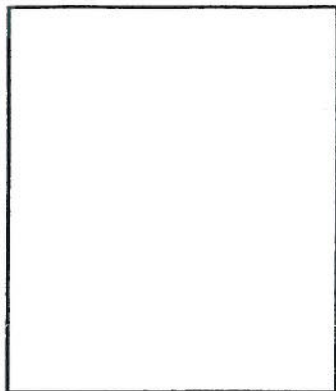

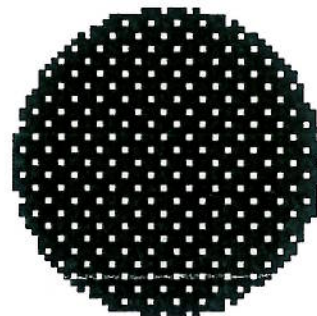
More Scratch 'n Sniffs!

aroma



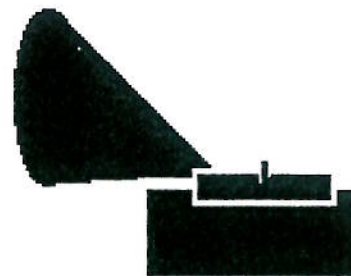
New Car scratch 'n sniff
